## Notes & Numbers

### Today's Match

► Chicago plays its third straight match and fifth of the year against a top-25 foe. Today's game also marks the Maroons' UAA home debut.

► The Maroons are coming off a 2-0 setback against 15th-ranked Wheaton (Ill.) Tuesday on the Stagg Field turf field. Chicago opened league play with a 5-1 loss last Saturday at ninth-ranked Emory.

► The Maroons are 2-2-2 at home this season. In its only previous game on the grass field, Chicago defeated Lake Forest 1-0 back on Sept. 28.

► Carnegie Mellon brings a 9-1-1 mark into today's tilt. The Tartans' only loss of the year was a 1-0 decision against UAA rival Washington-St. Louis this past Sunday in Pittsburgh. Carnegie Mellon sports a 6-0 record away from home.

► Carnegie Mellon holds a 15-2-4 series advantage over the Maroons dating back to 1987. Last year in Pittsburgh, the teams battled to a 2-2 deadlock.

### Most Recent Match - #15 Wheaton (Ill.) 2, Chicago 0

► Wheaton's (Ill.) **Joel DeLass** scored both goals as the 15th-ranked Thunder defeated Chicago 2-0 Tuesday night at Stagg Field.

► Wheaton outshot the Maroons 20-7. Freshman goalkeeper **Chris Giusto (Davie, Fla./ Heritage)** made six saves of his eight saves in the first half to keep Chicago in the match.

### Notes of Interest

► During his career, sophomore forward **Alex Clifford (Andover, Mass./ Phillips Academy Andover)** has tallied five goals in eight UAA matches. The 2007 UAA Rookie of the Year, Clifford scored a goal against Carnegie Mellon a year ago and has accounted for the Maroons' lone conference goal this season.

► Freshman goalkeeper **Chris Giusto (Davie, Fla./ Heritage)** boasts a 0.93 goals against average in six home appearances. In four road outings, his GAA stands at 2.41.

► The Maroons have been held to just one goal in the last 306:36 during their last four outings.

► Chicago is 4-1 when it scores the game's first goal, 0-4-1 when the opposition tallies first.

► The Maroons are 9-8-5 at home (8-6-3 grass, 1-2-2 FieldTurf) in three years under Head Coach **Scott Wiercinski**.
