Today's Match

► Chicago and NYU enter today's contest in seventh and eighth place, respectively, in the UAA standings.

► The Maroons picked up their first point in the league standings as they played to a 1-1 tie with Brandeis Friday night at Stagg Field. NYU remained winless in conference action as the result of a 2-1 overtime setback Friday at Washington.

► The Maroons wrap up the home portion of their 2008 slate this afternoon. Chicago is 2-3-3 at home (0-1-1 UAA) this season, including a 1-1 mark (0-1 UAA) on the grass pitch.

► NYU owns a 4-2-2 mark (0-2 UAA) away from home.

► NYU holds an 11-7-3 lead in the all-time series. The Violets defeated Chicago 3-2 last year in New York City. Chicago's last series victory was a 1-0 double overtime decision in 2004.

Most Recent Match – Chicago 1, Brandeis 1 (Oct. 17 at Stagg Field)

► Sophomore forward **Alex Clifford (Andover, Mass./ Phillips Academy Andover)** converted a penalty kick in the closing minutes of regulation as the Maroons played to a 1-1 tie with UAA rival Brandeis Friday night at Stagg Field.

► Clifford fired a shot into the lower right corner of the net with 2:28 remaining in the second half to send the game into overtime.

► Brandeis took the lead on an own goal at the 65:54 mark when a Chicago defender deflected a cross into his team's net.

► Brandeis played the final 2:28 of regulation and the entire overtime with 10 players as the result of a red card.

► The Judges outshot Chicago 20-12 for the match and 13-2 in the second period. Neither team attempted a shot in the first overtime stanza; Chicago posted a 3-2 edge in the second extra period.

► Freshman goalkeeper **Chris Giusto (Davie, Fla./ Heritage)** collected seven saves for the Maroons.

Notes of Interest

► Sophomore forward **Alex Clifford (Andover, Mass./ Phillips Academy Andover)** has scored six goals in 10 career UAA matches and has tallied in two of three league affairs this fall.

► Clifford's goal against Brandeis snapped the Maroons' 484:08 scoreless streak.

► Chicago is 4-1 when it scores the game's first goal, 0-5-2 when the opposition tallies first.

► The Maroons are 9-9-6 at home (8-7-3 grass, 1-2-3 FieldTurf) in three years under Head Coach **Scott Wiercinski**.
