Notes & Numbers

Tonight's Match

► Chicago plays its fourth match of the season against a nationally-ranked opponent. The Maroons are 1-2 against top-25 foes.

► The Maroons hope to rebound from a 5-1 loss at ninth-ranked Emory in their UAA opener Saturday afternoon. Wheaton extended its winning streak to five matches with a 1-0 win over Wisconsin-Whitewater this past Friday.

► The Maroons are 2-1-2 at Stagg Field this season, including a 1-1-2 mark on the turf field. In its most recent home affair, Chicago played Illinois Wesleyan to a scoreless tie a week ago.

► Since the first meeting in 1947, Wheaton holds a 32-9-4 series edge over the Maroons. The Thunder defeated Chicago 4-0 a year ago at Wheaton.

Most Recent Match – #9 Emory 5, Chicago 1

► Ninth-ranked Emory defeated the Maroons 5-1 in the UAA opener for both teams Saturday in Atlanta.

► Chicago scored 1:06 into the contest when sophomore forward **Alex Clifford (Andover, Mass./ Phillips Academy Andover)** tallied his second goal of the year off an assist from sophomore midfielder **Andy Dallos (Weston, Mass./ Weston)**.

Player Notes

► Freshman netminder **Chris Giusto (Davie, Fla./ Heritage)** has not allowed a goal in his last two matches at Stagg Field. In his last four home games, Giusto has posted a stingy 0.45 goals against average.

► Freshman midfielder **Stanton Coville (Powell, Ohio/ Olentangy Liberty)** has tallied three of his four goals at home.

► Coville leads the team with two game-winning goals. Junior forward **Edgar Friloux (Madison, Wis./ West)** and junior midfielder **Joseph Farias-Eisner (Calabasas, Calif./ Harvard-Westlake)** each have one game-winner to their credit.

Team Notes

► In its only previous night match of the year last Tuesday, Chicago and Illinois Wesleyan played to a scoreless tie at Stagg Field.

► Prior to Saturday's 5-1 loss at ninth-ranked Emory, Chicago had not allowed more than one goal in six games.

► Chicago is 4-1 when it scores the game's first goal, 0-3-1 when the opposition tallies first.

► With six second-half goals in its first eight matches, Chicago has already matched its total from all of last season.

► The Maroons are 9-7-5 at home (8-6-3 grass, 1-1-2 FieldTurf) in three years under Head Coach **Scott Wiercinski**.
