Today's Match

Chicago returns to UAA action needing a victory to remain in the hunt for the conference title ... A win would also bolster the Maroons' postseason chances, as the team currently stands ninth in this week's Central Region rankings ... Chicago is coming off a heartbreaking 3-2 double-overtime loss to top-ranked Wheaton (Ill.) Saturday at Stagg Field ... Case is mired in a six-game losing streak, during which it has been held scoreless five times - including four in a row.

Chicago vs. Case

The Maroons and Spartans meet for the 21st time since 1987 ... Chicago owns a 13-5-2 all-time lead and is 12-0-1 in the series dating back to 1994 ... Chicago defeated the Spartans 2-0 last year in Cleveland and 3-0 in the most recent affair at Stagg Field in 2005 ... Case's last series victory was a 2-0 decision at Stagg Field in 1993 ... The teams played to a 1-1 tie in Chicago in 2003.

Maroons at Stagg Field

Chicago owns a 4-2-1 mark at home this season, including a 0-0-1 mark in home UAA action ... Since the start of the 2002 campaign, the Maroons are 13-1-4 in conference play at Stagg Field ... In 17 years under Head Coach **Amy Reifert**, the Maroons have compiled a 122-27-14 mark in Chicago.

Manuelli Nets UAA Weekly Honors

Freshman midfielder **Katie Manuelli (Hightstown, N.J./ Peddie School)** was named the UAA player of the week after collecting two goals and an assist as the Maroons split a pair of non-conference matches last week at Stagg Field. She opened the week with a goal and an assist 40 seconds apart in a 4-0 win over Wisconsin-LaCrosse (Oct. 17) before scoring with just five seconds left in regulation to force overtime against top-ranked Wheaton (Ill.) three days later.

Gill Leading the UAA

Four games into the seven-game UAA schedule, no player has scored more goals than sophomore midfielder **Claire Gill (Los Altos Hills, Calif./ King's Academy)** ... Gill and Carnegie Mellon's **Abigail Coffin** have each tallied three times in league play (all three of Coffin's goals came against the Maroons on Oct. 6).

Working Overtime

Five of the Maroons' 15 matches have extended into overtime ... The Maroons are 1-1-3 in O.T. this season and 5-1-8 over their last 14 regular season overtime affairs ... Chicago is 3-1 in games following an overtime contest this year.

One Touches

Sophomore forward **Melissa Plesac (Hobart, Ind./ Hobart)** has found the back of the net in each of the Maroons' last two games ... Junior midfielder **Olivia Ndyabagye (Albuquerque, N.M./ Sandia)** sports a three-game points streak, with two goals and an assist during that stretch ... Sophomore midfielder **Claire Gill (Los Altos Hills, Calif./ King's Academy)** has scored goals in four of her last five outings ... Since the start of the 2003 campaign, Chicago is 66-2-2 in games in which it has scored the first goal ... After averaging 1.8 goals in their first 12 matches, the Maroons have tallied 10 times in their last three contests (3.3 per game).
