Notes & Numbers

Today's Match

Chicago wraps up non-conference play this afternoon against the top-ranked team in the NCAA Division III ... The Maroons boast a 7-2-1 mark in non-UAA play this season, including a 4-1 record at Stagg Field ... Chicago is unbeaten (2-0-1) in its last three games and is 3-1-2 over its last six outings ... The defending NCAA Division III champion, Wheaton is riding a 34-game winning streak – the second-longest in Division III history. That streak started with a 4-1 win over Chicago on Sept. 26, 2006.

Chicago vs. Wheaton

The Chicago-Wheaton series has become one of the most hotly-contested rivalries in the nation in recent years ... Wheaton leads the all-time series 12-9-3 since the first clash in 1987 ... Dating back to 1998, the rivalry is even at 6-6-2. During that stretch, the teams have split five games (2-2-1) in NCAA Division III tournament play ... In the 14 meetings since 1998, the Maroons are 3-2 at Stagg Field and 3-4-2 at Wheaton ... Last year, the Thunder defeated Chicago 4-1 in Wheaton ... In 2005, Chicago swept a pair of matchups at Stagg Field, both by 2-1 scores. The second of those matches sent the Maroons into the NCAA Division III quarterfinals.

Maroons at Stagg Field

Chicago owns a 4-1-1 mark at home this season and is 52-3-4 at Stagg Field dating back to the start of the 2002 campaign ... In 17 years under Head Coach **Amy Reifert**, the Maroons have compiled a 122-26-14 mark on their home turf.

Gill Scores Again

Sophomore midfielder **Claire Gill (Los Altos Hills, Calif./ King's Academy)** scored in the 63rd minute Wednesday against Wisconsin-LaCrosse to extend her goal-scoring streak to four games – the longest streak since senior forward **Christine Farmer (Pine City, N.Y./ Elmira Notre Dame)** tallied in the first four games of the 2006 campaign ... **Renee Neuner** in 2004 was the last Maroon to score in five consecutive matches.

Early and Often

Since the start of the 2003 campaign, Chicago owns a 66-2-2 mark in games in which it has scored first ... In their last three games, the Maroons have netted five goals in the first 11 minutes.

One Touches

Three of junior midfielder **Olivia Ndyabagye's (Albuquerque, N.M./ Sandia)** four goals this season, and five of 10 during her career, have been game-winners ... Freshman defender **Katie Manuelli (Hightstown, N.J./ Peddie School)** recorded her first career multiple-point effort with a goal and an assist on Wednesday ... **Manuelli** and sophomore forward **Melissa Plesac (Hobart, Ind./ Hobart)** each scored their first goal of the season on Wednesday, bringing to 14 the number of Maroons who have tallied at least once in 2007 ... Senior goalkeeper **Amanda Sutter (Irvine, Calif./ University)** has not allowed a goal in her last 261 minutes ... Junior defender **Anne Scherer (Cincinnati, Ohio/ St. Ursula)** collected her first career assist in Wednesday's win ... The Maroons are 5-0-8 in their last 13 regular season overtime games, including a 1-0-3 mark in 2007 ... After scoring just four goals in their previous five games, the Maroons have found the net eight times in their last two affairs.
